This vintage Boujad is composed of an intricate network of Berber symbolism, including lozenges, branches, eight pointed stars, and checkerboard motifs. A large chevron detail can be translated as either an agricultural or fertility symbol. The symbols are organized within blocks, creating an overall geometric structure to the piece. Woven in a unique palette of magenta, bright pink, orange, celadon green, and black wool on a cotton warp. Framed with partial side protection borders, and finished with a band of flatweave at one end.
