This colorful Boujad exhibits an overall lozenge network knotted in a faded palette of coral red, magenta, celadon green,, dark brown, charcoal grey and pale yellow. The pattern displays a few breaks, with a horizontal zig zag form and a connected chain of lozenges, adding moments of spontaneity. The selvage border is wider on one side, adding further asymmetry to the composition. Primarily wool with some cotton fibers present in the weft, common for utilitarian carpets from this region.
