Extremely generous in size, this vintage Moroccan carpet was created by the Aït Bou Ichaouen tribe (Talsint) near the village of Anoual. The length indicates this may have divided a tent, creating a separation between the women's weaving area and men's area. The repetitive diamond motif emulates an ancient Berber message this tribe has preserved in its isolation for many centuries. Palette includes a magenta background with motifs in violet, orange, celadon, and charcoal. 100% wool with an overall beautiful patina.
